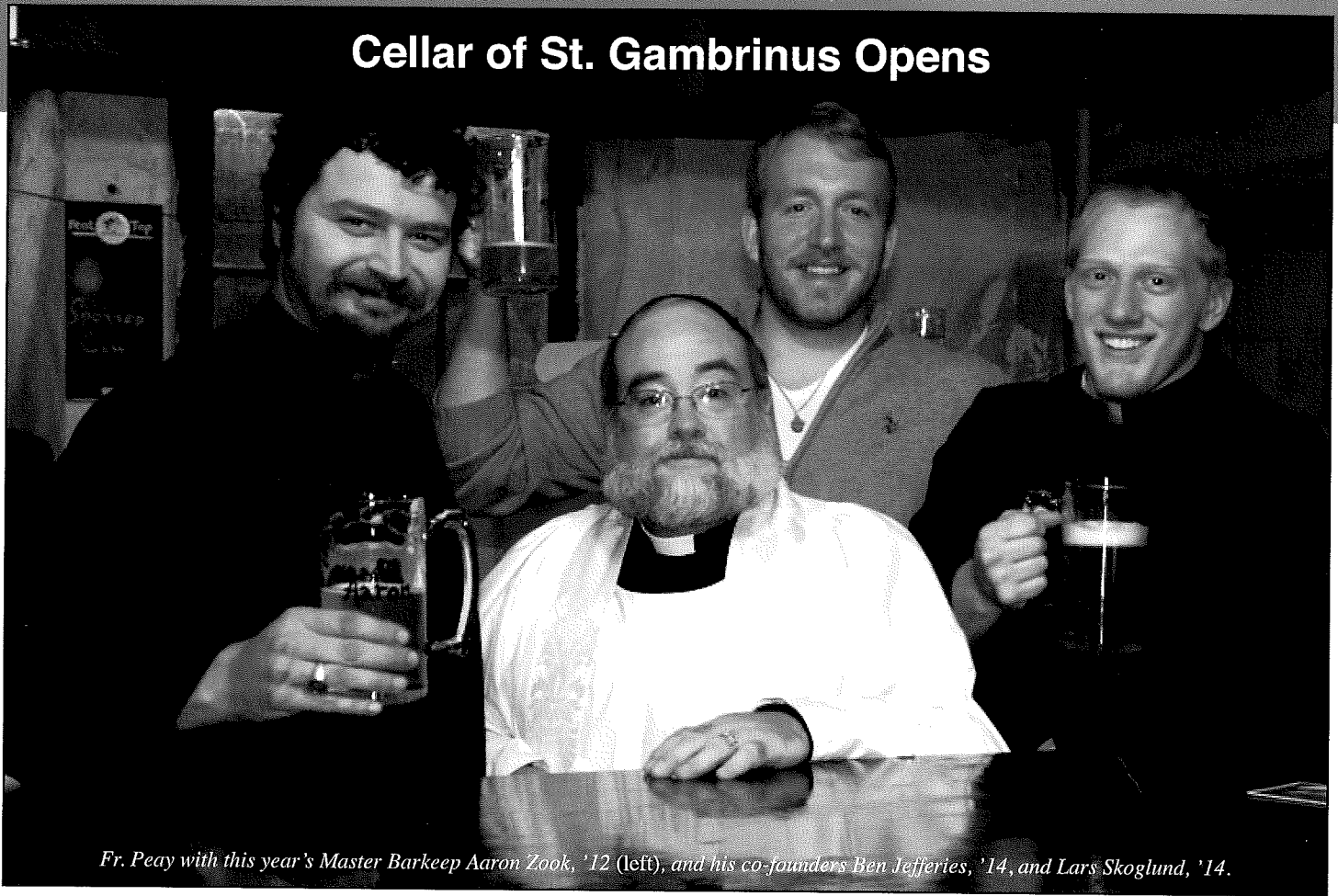


Cellar of St. Gambrinus Opens

Following Evening Prayer on November 4, a solemn procession crossed the campus from the Chapel of St. Mary the Virgin to Webb Hall, aka "the Fort," chanting the Litany of the Saints. Once having entered the towering tudor mansion, the procession descended into its dark, dank cellar in the bowels of which three students have built a bar. Bringing up the rear, Fr. Steven Peay, Associate Professor of Church History and an aficionado of fine brewing, led the company in a liturgy of

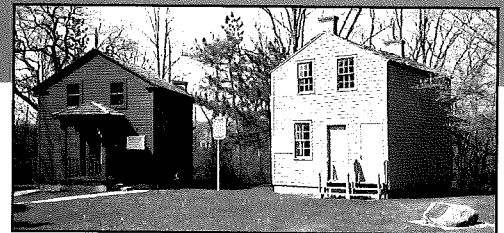
blessing, gassed the cellar with incense, liberally sloshed it with holy water, and declared "the Cellar of St. Gambrinus" open to the Nashotah House community.
